Carson used ddt to tell the broader story of the disastrous consequences of the overuse of insecticides and raised enough concern from her testimony before congress to trigger the establishment of the environmental protection agency

The author Rachel Carson's strike against the pesticide DDT turned her into a bot, malaria and the DDT story. DDT had an even more powerful repellency effect resulting in a 97% post-spray reduction of mosquitoes.
